- Support expanding S.T.E.M. education to include the arts to become S.T.E.A.M.
- Support an across-the-board charitable tax deduction so that all taxpayers, including non-itemizers, are encouraged to make donations to their favorite charities.
- Launch an "Artists Corps," through the Serve America Act provisions
- Support our creative sector with meaningful COVID-19 economic relief for arts groups and gig artists.

Senate Georgia Run-Offs



Nothing was "normal" about the year 2020, including this year's presidential and congressional elections. President Trump continues to use accusations rather than evidence to unsuccessfully overturn the election. Drawing out the final results further are the Senate run-off elections in Georgia on January 5, 2021. Since none of the candidates received at least 50% of the popular vote in November, Georgia is now required to have run-offs. Unusually, both of Georgia's U.S. Senate seats are up for election in the same year because one seat is for a special election and the other is in its normal re-election cycle.

These run-off elections are particularly important nationally. If Democrat challengers **Jon Ossoff** and **Rev. Raphael Warnock** win both seats, then control of the entire United States Senate would change from Republican to Democratic control.

Regardless of who wins, the Arts Action Fund is encouraging all Georgians to get out the vote again in record numbers. We are partnering with **Georgians for the Arts** and have enlisted the help once again from ArtsVote ambassadors **Annette Bening** and **Brian Stokes Mitchell** to make ArtsVote Georgia video PSAs and post social medial ads to educate arts voters at

Message from President & CEO Robert L. Lynch



"We need to do more."

Dear Arts Action Fund Member,

Americans for the Arts and its affiliate organizations have taken multiyear steps towards making racial and cultural equity the guiding principle in everything we do. Those steps have not been enough.

We need to do more – to increase our efforts and communicate those efforts to our stakeholders more effectively. To that end, the Americans for the Arts board has commissioned an Equity Task Force to be led by Abel Lopez, Chair of our Board Cultural Equity Committee and former Board Chair of Americans for the Arts. The Task Force will advise us on strategies for the field that will lead to transparent and accountable actions. The Task Force's members will consist of outside experts, as well as members of our board and staff. The Task Force gets underway in December, with Abel overseeing its work.

At its November meeting, the Americans for the Arts Board of Directors adopted a Statement of Recommitment to Racial and Cultural Equity, which includes specific financial targets; goals around the hiring of

vendors, contractors, and staff; enhanced measurement and accountability efforts; and more.

The Americans for the Arts Board is currently made up of 26 members, of whom 40% are Black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC). Two new members are to start in January 2021, and both with expertise in addressing issues of DEI. In 2021, the board will be 45% BIPOC. We will continue our efforts to increase diversity on the Board, for doing so is critical to the guiding principles of our organization. We are also working to ensure that we have BIPOC voices within our staff leadership, partners, and advisory groups.

GRASSROOTS ACTION

Arts Action Fund members vote overwhelmingly in favor of the 2020 legislative arts policy positions to be presented to Congress, as part of the National Arts Action Summit in Wash., D.C.

Feb. 6 LEGISLATIVE ACTION

ArtsVote 2020 Chair and musician **Ben Folds** interviews STEAM Caucus Co-Chair **Congresswoman Suzanne Bonamici** of Oregon about arts education policies, legislation, and funding at the federal level.

Feb. 6 LEGISLATIVE ACTION

ArtsVote 2020 Chair **Ben Folds** testifies before the House Interior Appropriations Subcommittee to urge increased federal funding for the National Endowment for the Arts at **\$170 million** for fiscal year 2021, a \$7.75 million increase over the current year's funding.

Feb. 25 POLITICAL ACTION

Arts Action Fund members are encouraged to get out the vote and ask arts policy questions to candidates during the Democratic Presidential primaries and debates. Major push takes place in February as a lead-up to Super Tuesday.

Mar. 26 LEGISLATIVE ACTION

COVID-19 Pandemic spreads across America and shuts down the economy. Arts Action Fund quickly rallies to secure eligibility to billions of dollars in economic relief for arts organizations and gig artists in the CARES Act. The \$2.3 trillion package passes unanimously through Congress. Arts Action Fund creates CARES Act Table, conducts webinars, and begins daily Zoom Office Hours with Nina.

Jul. 6 POLITICAL ACTION

Arts Action Fund members send thousands of messages to the Democratic and Republican National Committees to urge that an arts policy plank be incorporated into their policy platforms prior to the national conventions in August. Ultimately, the DNC included a strong arts plank that was unanimously adopted by Democrats across the country and **Joe** Biden as the Democratic nominee.

Jul. 7 LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The U.S House Interior **Appropriations** Subcommittee strongly rejects President Trump's fourth consecutive annual budget request to terminate both the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH). Instead, they approve \$170 million in funding each for FY21, matching the funding level requested in February by Ben Folds on behalf of the Arts Action Fund.

Sept. 22 MEDIA ACTION

In honor of National Voter Registration Day, Annette Bening and **Brian Stokes Mitchell** recruit many of their celebrity colleagues to put a spotlight on ArtsVote for the 9/22/20 episode of "Stars in the House." Additionally, many artists such as Iulianne Moore, Kenny Leon, Courtney B. Vance and more sign up to create one-minute ArtsVote video PSAs to promote voter

Oct. 2 MEDIA ACTION

The Arts Action Fund designs and places ads on Instagram,
Facebook, and Google to reach arts voters in 19 battleground states to ensure they make their vote count by learning the deadlines and committing to vote early.
Our paid social media ArtsVote ads reach over 4 million people in 40 days.

Oct. 19

ELECTORAL ACTION The Arts Action Fund releases its 2020 **Congressional Arts** Report Card, providing analysis of arts voting records and leadership information for every Member of Congress (House and Senate) prior to the elections. The Congressional Arts Report Card also serves as the guide for providing Arts Action Fund PAC support to incumbent Congressional arts leaders.

Nov. 3

ELECTORAL ACTION On Election Day, voter turnout reaches 66.5% with a record level of 154 million votes and counting. More than 80 million Americans vote for President-Elect Joe Biden who wins in a landslide over incumbent President Donald Trump with an electoral college vote of 306-232. As President-Elect Biden and Vice President-Elect Harris form their transition team to "Build Back Better," they select Bob Lynch to serve on the Arts & Culture Agency Review Team.
