FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS

Federal Appropriation FY24 **\$207 Million**

Congress allocated **\$207 million** to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in **FY24**. This amounts to just **62 cents per capita**. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

THE ARTS ARE EVERYWHERE

- The **Saint Louis** Art Fair has returned to live exhibits in downtown Clayton, Missouri, a prestigious business and residential community neighboring St. Louis.
- In **Hannibal**, the birthplace of Samuel Clemens, the literature of Mark Twain continues to inspire, engage, and entertain, and the man himself makes an appearance at least once a year at the Twain on Main Festival.
- If you value fact over fiction, you would enjoy going to **Columbia** for the True/False Film Festival, called "The most important documentary festival in America" by the Los Angeles Times.
- In 2024, ArtsKC launched, in partnership with the Bloch Family Foundation, a new access-ticketing program called, **The Drop**. This program seeks to eliminate barriers to access the arts for residents throughout the KC Metro region. By offering access to \$10 tickets, low-income communities now have greater access to the arts than ever before.
- Friday Art Walks bring people into local downtown areas and stimulate the economy in cities like **Springfield, Lee's Summit, Ste. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau, and Hermann**.
- The Scott Joplin International Ragtime Festival held each spring in **Sedalia** celebrates the important contributions to American music by Joplin, who spent many years composing and playing in this central Missouri town.
- The Sculpture Walk of **Saint Joseph** introduces contemporary outdoor public art and sculptures to the entire community. The juried exhibits, on loan to the city for one year, is made possible by a partnership with the city, the Downtown Community Improvement District and individual sponsors.
- Fine Arts Education Day sponsored by the **Missouri Alliance for Arts Education** brings hundreds of students from diverse backgrounds to perform at the state capitol in **Jefferson City** each March. The night before, advocacy training sessions prepare students in the Show-Me Arts program to be effective advocates and meet with their state senators and representatives.
