### FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS

**Federal Appropriation** FY24 \$207 Million

Congress allocated \$207 million to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in FY24. This amounts to just 62 cents per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

### THE ARTS ARE EVERYWHERE

- The Saint Louis Art Fair has returned to live exhibits in downtown Clayton, Missouri, a prestigious business and residential community neighboring St. Louis.
- In Hannibal, the birthplace of Samuel Clemens, the literature of Mark Twain continues to inspire, engage, and entertain, and the man himself makes an appearance at least once a year at the Twain on Main Festival.
- If you value fact over fiction, you would enjoy going to Columbia for the True/False Film Festival, called "The most important documentary festival in America" by the Los Angeles Times.
- In 2024, ArtsKC launched, in partnership with the Bloch Family Foundation, a new access-ticketing program called, The **Drop**. This program seeks to eliminate barriers to access the arts for residents throughout the KC Metro region. By offering access to \$10 tickets, lowincome communities now have greater access to the arts than ever before.
- Friday Art Walks bring people into local downtown areas and stimulate the economy in cities like Springfield, Lee's Summit, Ste. Genevieve, Cape Girardeau, and Hermann.
- The Scott Joplin International Ragtime Festival held each spring in Sedalia celebrates the important contributions to American music by Joplin, who spent many years composing and playing in this central Missouri town.

- Fine Arts Education Day sponsored by the Missouri Alliance for Arts Education brings hundreds of students from diverse backgrounds to perform at the state capitol in Jefferson City each March.
