## FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS

#### **Federal Appropriation FY24** \$207 Million

Congress allocated \$207 million to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in FY24. This amounts to just 62 cents per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

North Carolina is an artistically vibrant state thanks to deeply rooted traditions and extensive investment in supporting the arts in every corner of the state. In 1977, the North Carolina General Assembly established the Grassroots Arts Program to ensure that all people in North Carolina have access to quality arts experiences. The program provides funding for the arts in all 100 counties. The investments made through the Grassroots Arts Program have resulted in the development and deepening of the work of local arts agencies throughout the state. Today, North Carolina boasts one of the largest and most developed networks of local arts agencies in the nation. Grassroots funds support hundreds of arts activities across the state each year. The Arts Council also supports a large and diverse network of arts organizations throughout the state.
