Congress allocated \$207 million to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in FY24. This amounts to just 62 cents per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

#### IN THE EVERGREEN STATE, THE ARTS AND CULTURE UNITE US



The Washington State Arts Commission (ArtsWA) launched its **Tribal Cultural Affairs program** in 2023—the first of its kind in the nation—to support Washington Tribal communities as they expand, enhance, or create space for art and culture. Inspire Washington successfully sheparded in cultural access with their program **Doors Open** which was unanimously approved by King County's council-members. This will result in public funding of science, heritage and the arts will increase by \$90+ million annually with a small sales tax that King County residents will pay.
