
WHY THE ARTS MATTER IN IOWA



NATIONAL ARTS FACTS

FOR-PROFIT & NON-PROFIT ARTS & CULTURE SECTORS REPRESENT



The national arts and culture sector was a **\$1.102 trillion industry** in **2022** (**4.31%** of the nation's GDP), representing **5.2 million jobs** (**3.28%** of nation's workforce), and total compensation of **\$540.9 billion**.


FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS

Federal Appropriation FY24\$207 Million

Congress allocated **\$207 million** to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in **FY24**. This amounts to just **62 cents per capita**. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

The lowa arts and culture sector was a **\$5 billion** industry in **2022** (**2.1%** of the state's GDP), representing **41,810 jobs** (**2.57%** of lowa's workforce), and total compensation of **\$2.7 billion**.

THE ARTS ARE EVERYWHERE

- Clear Lake's iconic Surf Ballroom, a National Historic Landmark and staple in American rock n' roll history, is a muststop for any visitor to North Iowa, along with neighboring community, Mason City, which inspired Broadway composer Meredith Wilson to write "The Music Man" and is also home to the last remaining Frank Lloyd Wright designed and built hotel in the world.
- Film and media has a major presence in lowa. In addition to being a popular site for filming and filmmakers, lowa boasts more than a dozen local independent film festivals, including the Julien **Dubuque** International Film Festival in **Dubuque** and the Snake Alley Film Festival in **Burlington**.
- Visit **lowa City**, one of just two UNESCO Cities of Literature in the United States, and home to the famous International Writers Program and the lowa Writers' Workshop.

- Stop by lowa's largest mural painted on all sides of a 110-ft grain silo along the river in Fort Dodge.
- Visitors to lowa's capital city, Des Moines named one of the 40 most arts vibrant cities in the nation - will enjoy a visit to the John & Mary Pappajohn Sculpture Park; world-class museums, botanical gardens and a zoo; and Mainframe Studios, the nation's largest, affordable artist workspace center. Greater Des Moines is also home to Broadway performances, at Des Moines Performing Arts, and one the country's premier opera companies in nearby Indianola, while nearby Ames, home to lowa State University and more museums and cultural attractions, is just north of the city.
- Northeast lowa is well-known for culture and creativity. Start in Waterloo-Cedar Falls, home to college and nonprofit arts centers and galleries, and head north into

into the Driftless Region. Stop in **Charles City**, home to the Mooney Art Collection, along the way to **Decorah**, a college town home to many writers, artists and musicians.

 Arts, culture and heritage are around every turn in Southwest and West Central Iowa. The Hoff Family Art Center in Council Bluffs is a creative incubator for all of the fine and culinary arts. Travel to the small town of **Manning** to take your picture in front of the giant IOWA sculpture in Trestle Park and visit the Hausbarn Heritage Park. The popular Southwest Iowa Arts Tour takes visitors through many cities each fall, including **Malvern**, where visitors can stay overnight in a church transformed into an art studio; Clarinda, home to a growing collection of contemporary art amassed by visionary collectors Robert and Karen Duncan: and Woodbine. a rural hub for creatives and an Iowa Great Place.
