## FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE **NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS**

**Federal Appropriation FY24** \$207 Million

Congress allocated \$207 million to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in FY24. This amounts to just 62 cents per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

#### **Upper Valley**

Park on the Common in Lebanon and walk to several venues; you can visit AVA Gallery and Art Center, Lebanon Opera House, and Upper Valley Music Center. Then get on your bicycle and check out the public art on the Mascoma River Greenway! In the summer, hear world class opera with Opera North.

#### **North Country**

Head north to get your inner poet inspiration at the Frost Place in Franconia, then tour the Art Walk. From there, it's just a short trip to see a performance at the Colonial Theater and contemporary art exhibits at WREN in Bethlehem. In August, visit the annual League of NH Craftsmen Fair at Mount Sunapee in Newbury. In September, put on your kilt and get out the bagpipes for the annual NH Highland Games and Festival at Loon Mountain in Lincoln.

#### **Lakes Region**

In Meredith, tour the Sculpture Walk, take in a show at the Winnipesaukee Playhouse, and expand your art collection at the Lakes Region Art Association gallery in Tilton.

#### **Seacoast**

See shows in Portsmouth at The Music Hall and Prescott Park Arts Festival, and the Hampton Beach Casino Ballroom in Hampton. Take music or art classes at the Portsmouth Music and Arts Center. Check out offerings at 3S ArtSpace and Market Square Day from Pro Portsmouth. Public art is plentiful in downtown Dover, and if you're looking for something to do with the kids, visit the Children's Museum of New Hampshire.

#### Monadnock

Keene has a walkable downtown with an opportunity to see dance at MoCo teaching facility, visual arts at the Thorne-Sagendorph Gallery and performances at the Redfern Arts

Center, Colonial Theater and The Showroom. Stop in Peterborough to take in a play from the Peterborough Players and Raylynmor Opera. Arts Alive! has a terrific events calendar here.

### **Merrimack Valley**

Check out Main Street and public art in the capitol city of Concord and take in shows at the Capitol Center for the Arts and Bank of New Hampshire Stage. Tour Nashua's public sculpture collection, commissioned by the Nashua International Sculpture Symposium, and murals throughout the city from Positive Street Art. Visit the Currier Museum, and enjoy shows at The Palace Theatre and The Rex Theatre in Manchester.
