## **FEDERAL FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS**

Federal Appropriation FY23 \$207 Million

SBA SVOG Grants FY21-22 \$13 Billion

Congress allocated \$207 million to the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in FY23. This amounts to just 62 cents per capita. Ideally, Congress should index \$1 per capita funding to the NEA.

- Over in Jacksonville, Cathedral Arts Project unleashes the creative power of young people by partnering with 25 schools and educational sites to bring

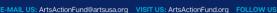
- arts education to underserved schoolaged children.

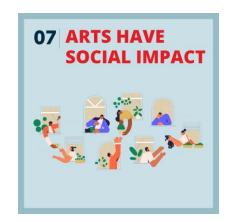






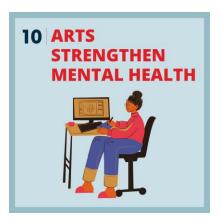












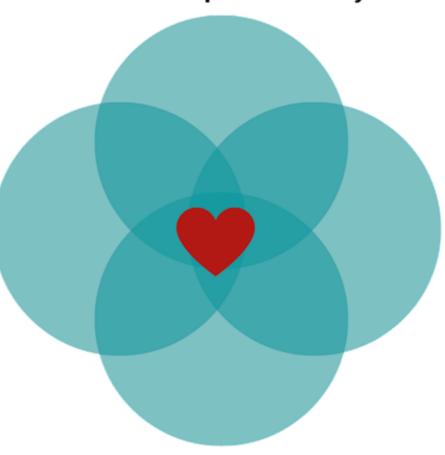

## **Key Principles of Advocacy**

- 1. Identify and learn more about the priorities of your targeted elected officials.
- 2. Match up your priorities with the elected official's priorities.
- 3. Establish a working relationship will all your elected officials.
- 4. Develop coalitions and partnerships with many groups.
- 5. Gather relevant data and provide real life testimonial stories.
- 6. Be an advocate year-round.
- 7. Engage the media on your issues.
- 8. Engage your social media and tag elected officials.
- 9. Be an influencer in your community.
- 10. Practice your elevator speech.
